Authorities have isolated two UPS cargo planes at Philadelphia International Airport following a report of a suspicious package on one of the planes. Another plane was isolated in Newark, New Jersey.

Local and federal authorities are investigating a suspicious package aboard a UPS plane that landed at Philadelphia International Airport at about 9 a.m. local time from Paris, France. The second plane, from Cologne, Germany, was isolated near the UPS terminal. The plane from Germany landed in Philadelphia at about 8 a.m. and was scheduled to depart at 10:30 a.m. for Louisville, Kentucky. At about the same, a third plane landed safely at Newark International Airport and was isolated.

Authorities say the incident Philadelphia began when a crew member aboard the plane from Paris notified authorities on approach about a suspicious package. The crew member described a possible radiological component to the package.

The two crew members safely exited the aircraft after landing in a remote area of the airport.

An airport spokeswoman says Philadelphia police and other agencies are with the plane at a remote part of the airport. She referred all other questions to the Department of Homeland Security.

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) released a statement and said they, "Are aware of and monitoring reports of potentially suspicious items onboard cargo flights that landed safely at Newark Liberty and Philadelphia International airports. Out of an abundance of caution the planes were moved to a remote location where they are being met by law enforcement officials and swept."

A New York police spokesman said a United Parcel Service (UPS.N) delivery truck was also being investigated in the city's borough of Queens, but no further details were immediately available.

The incidents remain under investigation. Operations at Philadelphia International Airport have not been affected. No delays are reported.





(U//FOUO/LES)—UPDATE: Upon the advice of a foreign intelligence service, additional scrutiny was placed on the previously cleared printer toner cartridge in England. Further examination revealed wires attached or inside the cartridge. Very preliminary information received by SIOC indicates that, after further review, the item "is an IED." Additional information being received indicates that the cartridge in Dubai, UAE is identical to the UK cartridge. Authorities are preparing to re-examine.

(U//FOUO/LES) In an abundance of caution, additional UPS/FedEx packages from Yemen have been identified as inbound to or on the ground in the United States. FBIHQ has been making notifications to various field offices regarding this shipments. TSA is also aware of these packages.

Airport authorities said public areas had continued to operate throughout the incident.

"This has meant that a freight distribution building and a number of offices have been closed together with internal airport roads - Beverley Road and Argosy Road."

A Boeing Co. 767 from Paris and an MD-11 from Cologne, Germany, both landed safely in Philadelphia, and items on board are being investigated, a spokesman for Atlanta- based UPS, said today in a telephone interview. The third plane is a 767 that arrived at New Jersey's Newark airport from East Midlands, U.K.

Additionally, a suspicious package was found in a UPS facility outside London.

The device - a printer toner cartridge that may have been modified into an explosive - was discovered early Friday and turned over to authorities. The package may have originated in Yemen, according to authorities.

It was not immediately clear what connected the UPS vehicles in the city and the cargo company's planes that have been cordoned off on the tarmacs of Newark Liberty Airport and Philadelphia International Airport.

At both airports, the planes landed safely and were removed to a remote part of the tarmacs. Investigators were searching both planes Friday morning.

A number of planes at Newark-Liberty International Airport in New Jersey, John F. Kennedy International Airport in New York and Philadelphia International Airport in Pennsylvania were moved to remote locations where they are being met by law enforcement officials and swept for potentially dangerous devices.

Sources say potential improvised explosives were shipped from Yemen through Birmingham, England, to the U.S. aboard planes including the one grounded at Newark-Liberty.

At least 15 devices are believed to have been constructed for shipment in the plot. It is unknown how many have reached the U.S.

A spokesperson for UPS said the company is cooperating with authorities in Philadelphia and Newark.

"Out of caution, we isolated the aircraft at these locations and the shipments in question are being removed," UPS said in a statement to ABC News.







Current: The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) Transportation Sector Network Management has received confirmation from FedEx that the 23 shipments in their system from Yemen are now out of their system. Nine packages are being held by security at Charles de Gaulle International Airport in Paris; two were seized by the Federal Bureau of Investigation; eleven are being held by Fed-Ex in Dubai; and one package was the suspect printer/toner cartridge found in England.

Future: TSA will provide a team consisting of international transportation personnel to conduct a survey of the cargo procedures and practices, identify vulnerabilities, and provide recommendations and practical training to the government of Yemen for Sana'a International Airport. The team will also bring portable explosive trace detection units to Sana'a to assist in screening and movement of existing cargo from Yemen destined to the US. The DHS National Operations Center will continue to monitor this incident and provide updates as warranted. The next scheduled update report will be published at 0600 EDT, 31 Oct 10.





ACTION: TSA will provide a team consisting of international transportation personnel to conduct a survey of the cargo procedures and practices, identify vulnerabilities, and provide recommendations and practical training to the government of Yemen for Sana'a International Airport. The team will also bring portable explosive trace detection units to Sana'a to assist in screening and movement of existing cargo from Yemen destined to the US. US intelligence, law enforcement, and DHS continue steps to determine whether these threats are part of any additional terrorist plotting. In cooperation with authorities, FedEx and United Parcel Service have implemented a shipment embargo on all packages originating from Yemen. The DHS National Operations Center will continue to monitor this incident and provide updates as warranted.

FUTURE PLANS: LANT and NCC will continue to monitor.

STATEMENT BY SECRETARY NAPOLITANO ON INCREASED SECURITY MEASURES

"Following the thwarted terrorist plot last week to conceal and ship explosive devices on board aircraft bound for the U.S., the Administration took a number of immediate steps to increase security by tightening existing measures related to cargo bound for the United States.

Some of the steps that have been taken by the Department of Homeland Security included adapting inbound cargo targeting rules to reflect the latest intelligence and ordering a ground halt on all cargo coming from Yemen. In addition, Transportation Security Administration (TSA) Administrator John S. Pistole and a team of TSA inspectors visited Yemen to meet with government security officials and to assist in enhancing Yemen's security procedures, which are necessary to eventually lift the ground halt on cargo.

Late last week, TSA directed industry carriers to begin implementing additional precautionary security measures for international flights inbound to the United States. These measures take effect today. Specifically, the ban on air cargo from Yemen will continue and has been extended to all air cargo from Somalia as well. In addition, no high risk cargo will be allowed on passenger aircraft. Toner and ink cartridges over 16 ounces will be prohibited on passenger aircraft in both carry-on bags and checked bags on domestic and international flights in-bound to the United States. This ban will also apply to certain inbound international air cargo shipments as well. Further, all cargo identified as high risk will go through additional and enhanced screening. These measures also impact inbound international mail packages, which must be screened individually and certified to have come from an established postal shipper.

The Administration is also working closely with industry and our international partners to expedite the receipt of cargo manifests for international flights to the United States prior to departure in order to identify and screen items based on risk and current intelligence. We are also working with our international and private sector partners on the expansion of layered detections system including technology and other measures.

As always, the safety and security of the American public is our highest priority. The threats of terrorism we face are serious and evolving, and these security measures reflect our commitment to using current intelligence to stay ahead of adversaries—working closely with our international, federal, state, local and private sector partners every step of the way. We encourage our partners, as well as our citizens, to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity to local law enforcement authorities."





Secretary of Homeland Security Priorities

• (U) Ensure the safety and security of the American people by focusing on enhanced screening procedures, retrieving suspicious packages and seeking to determine whether these threats are a part of any additional terrorist plotting.

Current Situation

- (U) Intelligence and law enforcement agencies discovered potential suspicious packages on 2 planes in transit to the United States 28 Oct.
- (U) Based on close cooperation among U.S. government agencies and with U.S. foreign allies and partners, authorities were able to identify and examine 2 suspicious packages, 1 in East Midlands, United Kingdom, and 1 in Dubai.
- Both packages originated from Yemen.
- (U) A total of 38 shipments were identified as arriving on 29 Oct from Yemen.
 - 6 are on hold and pending examination in JFK.
 - 6 have been examined and held by CBP.
 - 1 has been examined and released, pending redelivery.
 - 4 have not been examined and are pending redelivery.
 - 21 have been delivered to the consignee with no examination, ports have been notified to contact local JTTF and provide them with the shipment information.
- (U) The packages were addressed to Jewish organizations in the US.
- (U) Examination of the packages determined that the explosive used was Pentaerythritol tetranitrate (PETN)
- (U) Philadelphia International and Newark International airports are operating normally. (TSA)
- (U) The aircraft at Newark was cleared by Port Authority and FBI K9; all packages as non-hazardous. (TSA)
- (U) The 2 aircraft at Philadelphia were cleared with negative findings. (TSA)
- (U) The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) issued an Aviation Security Directive and Aviation Emergency Amendment for cargo originating in Yemen.

- The restrictions expire on 1 Nov at 1200 EST and apply to all US and foreign flagged carriers bound for the US.
- The restrictions require all carriers to off-load all cargo originating in Yemen at their next available destination (if airborne), off-load any current Yemen cargo if not airborne, and refuse to carry additional Yemen cargo.
- (U) No more packages will be processed for 48 hours in Sana, Yemen. (TSA)
- (U) The United Kingdom Department for Transport has also issued a Restricted (similar to our TSA) advisory letter to industry in the UK (air carriers, airports, regulated air cargo agents, in-flight suppliers and airport police agencies) advising of the threat and the need for increased vigilance.

Federal Agencies/Departments

Department of Homeland Security (DHS)

- (U) DHS has taken a number of steps to enhance security including heightened cargo screening and additional security at airports.
 - Passengers should continue to expect an unpredictable mix of security layers that include explosives trace detection, advanced imaging technology, canine teams and pat downs.

DHS Intelligence and Analysis (I&A)

- o (CBU) Package delivered to JP Morgan reportedly similar to Midland package.
- o (U) Queens and Brooklyn packages have been screened and cleared.

Transportation Security Administration (TSA)

- (U) Office of Global Strategies (OGS) International Inspection Team scheduled to deploy to Yemen on 31 Oct.
- (U) TSA activated their Critical Incident Management Group (CIMG); all communications related to the FedEx/UPS Threat is to be directed to the CIMG until further notice.
- (EBU) Additional packages from Yemen located in Dubai have been isolated with no screening anomalies; packages have been turned over to Fire department per FEDEX corporate security.
- (SBU) The Department of Homeland Security reports the plane in Newark has been searched and determined to be clear of explosives.
- o (GBU) The search of the 2 planes in Philadelphia is still underway.
- (SBU) Added description associated with contents of suspicious packages for special screening.

Department of Defense (DoD)

 (U) Fighter jets that were scrambled to escort an incoming flight from Dubai have returned to home station with no incidents; all cargo from the escorted aircraft has been removed and screened without incident.

• Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Counterterrorism Watch (CT Watch)

- (SBU) 2 packages containing printers sent via commercial shipping companies UPS and FEDEX from Sana, Yemen to Chicago, Illinois, United States, were believed to have explosives in the printers' toner cartridges. (COMMENT: The explosives may be in liquid form.) (CT Watch)
- (SBU) FEDEX Package was sent from Yemen American Center for Training and Development.

- (CBU) UPS Package came from the Yemen Computer Institute.
- Credible source stated explosives contained in toner cartridges were intended to be detonated while in the air. (CT Watch)
